The Project

The epidemiologist and artist Nikolai Hodel slept in a display window from the Society of Arts Kleinster Kunstraum Olten), at the main train station in Olten.

The train station is known as the crossing between all north-south and east-west bound train lines in Switzerland.

From his simulated Capsule Hotel he is going to work in his office in Basel and tours the country

without a steady home for 10 days. The only possessions are a general train admission card,

a laptop, an income source, clean clothing and a key to the bed in the display window

at the main train station in Olten. During the self-experiment Nikolai Hodel went through a catalogue of questions, similarly to those applied in qualitative epidemiology, in order to assess our relation between living space,

urban sprawl and socio-ecological consequences of the rapid spatial dispersion in Switzerland.

The project was well documented and three articles were produced in collaboration with the local

newspaper. Further the project is summarized in a booklet and displayed in 2019 in the display window and presented by the art i.g.
